Trish Pagan is vice president of Air Mobility & Maritime Missions (AMMM) and the Marietta site general manager.

In this role, she is responsible for the strategic growth and execution of the AMMM line of business, specifically the C-130 Hercules, the C-5 strategic airlifter, the LM-100J commercial air freight variant and the P-3 Orion. As site general manager for the Marietta manufacturing facility, she is responsible for the day-to-day operations. In addition to the AMMM line of business, the Marietta site manufactures center wing assemblies for the F-35 Lightning II multirole fighter aircraft, provides sustainment support for the F-22 Raptor and supports a number of Skunk Works® program activities.

Previously, Ms. Pagan served as the vice president of F-16 programs and site lead of Lockheed Martin's Greenville, S.C., facility, where she was responsible for strategic direction, performance and growth of the F-16 product portfolio. She also led the more than 1,800-person operation in Greenville, which manufactures and sustains F-16 aircraft and performs sustainment work for other platforms.

Before that, Ms. Pagan was vice president of AMMM international programs, directing the overall strategy to create value for all stakeholders involved in the AMMM aircraft portfolio and overseeing development, production and sustainment contracts worldwide.

Ms. Pagan joined Lockheed Martin in 2000 as a financial analyst on the U.S. Navy P-3 aircraft program. Over her 25-year career, she has held a series of increasingly responsible roles including Greenville site program manager, director of strategic airlift and maritime missions, chief of staff and executive project assistant to the Aeronautics president and the executive leadership team.

She holds a bachelor's degree in accounting from Clemson University.
