

Lockheed Martin Receives Nearly \$5 Billion in Defense Contracts

Overview:

Since the beginning of 2018, Lockheed Martin received 18 contracts, with awards totaling roughly \$5 billion, improving training and logistics, and increasing sustainment across branches of the Armed Forces. Delivering cost-effective training, logistics and sustainment solutions, Lockheed Martin is enabling mission readiness aligning with our customer's emerging requirements.

Notable Contracts:

- Army TADSS Maintenance Program (ATMP): A seven-year, \$3.53 billion contract to globally sustain more than 300,000 fielded Training Aids, Devices, Simulators and Simulations (TADSS), including live-fire ranges and instrumentation systems for the U.S. Army. ATMP allows maintainers to use mobile devices with advanced management information technology to efficiently and effectively track and maintain a wide range of training systems.
- Air Commando Training and Support (ACTS): A contract providing comprehensive training support services for the Air Force Special Operations Command (AFSOC), supporting schoolhouse operations for various crew positions across multiple mission design series aircraft, aircrew training and support for AFSOC Special Operation Forces (SOF) aircrews and assets. The contract is valued at up to \$470 million lasting up to eight years.
- Close Combat Tactical Trainer (CCTT) Manned Module Modernization (M3): Nearly 500 simulators will be upgraded for the Army's tactical vehicle fleet at dozens of locations worldwide. Valued at up to \$356 million, this modernizes training while increasing sustainability in support of emerging Army training requirements and systems. This system integrates all facets of combat operations, immersing soldiers in real-world battle scenarios through computer-based simulations.
- Electronic Consolidated Automated Support Systems (eCASS): A U.S. Navy contract valued at more than \$500 million to build and deliver more than 200+ eCASS to maximize aircraft readiness. Sailors use eCASS to troubleshoot and repair aircraft electronics ashore and at sea, allowing them to return aircraft such as the F/A-18 and E-2D to operational status quickly and efficiently.
